The City of Emeryville is providing FREE Kitchen Pails for you to collect food waste in your own unit. You may pick it up at

The pail's label shows what you can compost, including all food scraps and all food-soiled paper (like coffee cups, napkins, pizza boxes, and paper or fiber to-go boxes).

When the pail is full, empty it into the green cart in your building's trash area, and wash it out with your dishes.

Remember: Composting helps reduce greenhouse gases by keeping organics out of the landfill and making compost for agricultural use instead. (More information is at http://epa.gov/climatechange/qhqemissions/gases/ch4.html)

Tips to keep your kitchen pail clean—it's easy!

- Use paper to wrap food waste to absorb liquids, cut down odor, and reduce flies.
- Include all food-related paper, such as pizza boxes, paper towels, napkins, and to-go containers made of paper or fiber.
- Empty your food waste often into the building's compost collection container, and wash out your kitchen pail between uses.

Note: No plastics, glass, or metal of any kind belong in the food waste pail.





Did you know? Paper absorbs liquids, which harbor bacteria, which cause odors.

Why compost food scraps?

To reduce methane: A greenhouse gas 25 times more potent than carbon dioxide and a major contributor to climate change.

To save money: Compost and recycling are FREE for residential customers in Emeryville.
