### First, identify the violation you would like to address:

## >> Failure to provide recycling and/or organics service.

#### How to Correct: Order recycling and/or organics collection service.

To begin service at your location, contact the service provider for your city. You can determine your service provider by visiting <a href="https://www.RecyclingRulesAC.org/cities-overview">www.RecyclingRulesAC.org/cities-overview</a> and selecting your city. ### And/Or: Provide documentation of existing recycling/organics collection service.

If you currently have recycling/organics service established at your location, you'll need to provide documentation of this service by updating our records online at: www.RecyclingRulesAC.org/CRS.

For compliance with the ordinance, materials may be self-hauled, back-hauled, collected by a franchised hauler, taken by a contracted third-party, and/or collected via shared service with another account holder. Informal or unlicensed scavengers that collect recyclables do not meet the requirements for collection under the Mandatory Recycling Ordinance.

### How to Correct: Help staff, tenants, and/or contractors separate materials correctly.
